"Actual Reality"

#3 To reply, have your C.P.U., or brain, compose a "sentence," a grammatically self-contained speech unit made up of words.

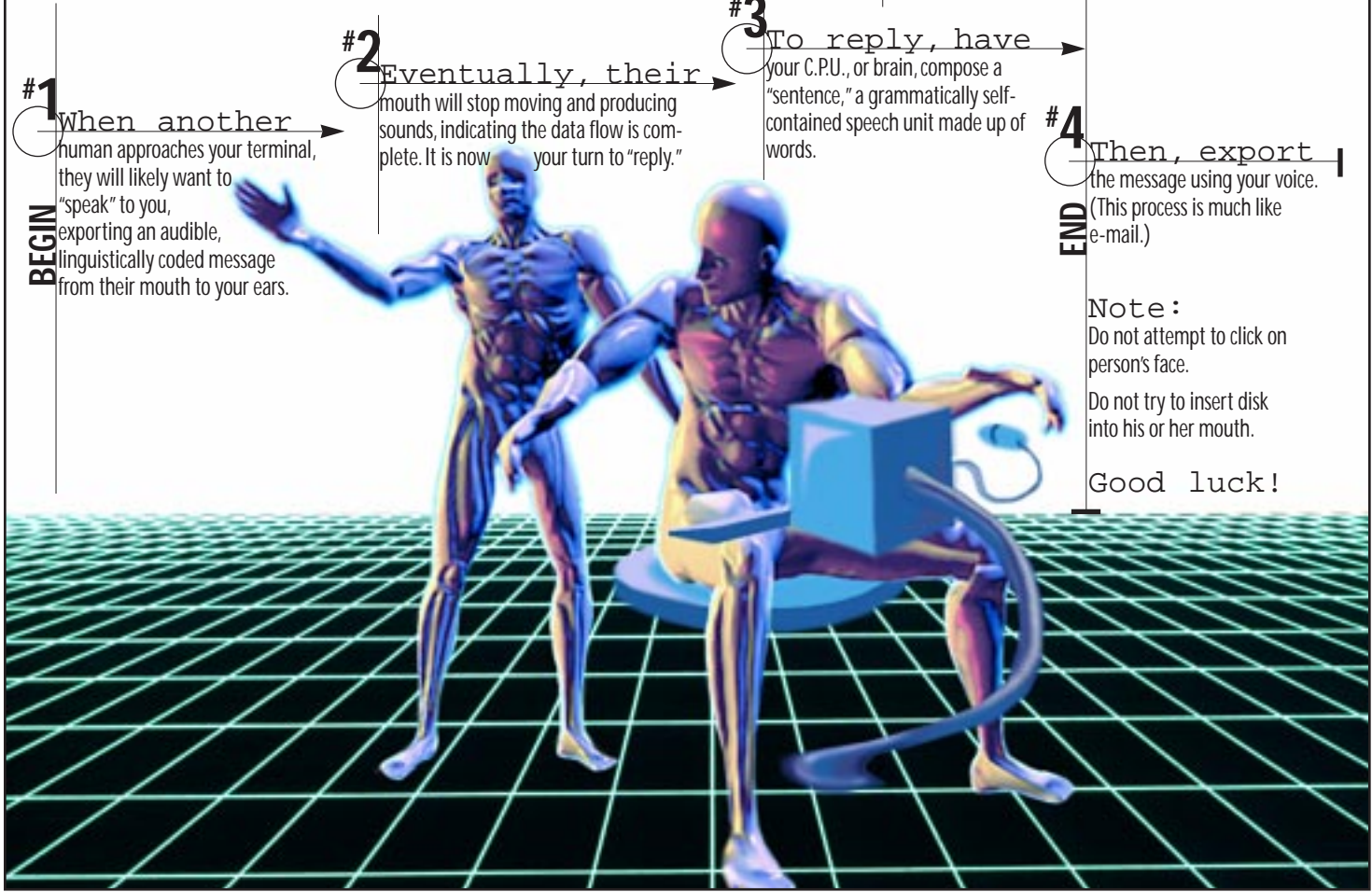
#4 Then, export the message using your voice. (This process is much like e-mail.)
